ASSOCIATION FOR PUBLIC ART HOSTS "SCULPTURE ZOO IN RITTENHOUSE SQUARE"

A free family-friendly event that showcases artists and live animals to highlight public art.

PHILADELPHIA, PA, July 13, 2015 — The **Association for Public Art (aPA)**, with support from Apartment Investment and Management Company (Aimco) and in partnership with Philadelphia Parks & Recreation, presents "*Sculpture Zoo in Rittenhouse Square*" on Saturday, August 8th from **10am to 1pm.** All are invited to enjoy free, fun-filled interactive activities that will enliven the Square's public artworks.

Discover live animals on location: a small reptile near *Lion Crushing a Serpent,* a goat next to *Billy,* and a bird nearby *Duck Girl.* There will be sculpture demonstrations by local artists, inspired by the animals – a common practice of the sculptors whose works are located in the Square. Friends and family are invited to participate in sculpture-making workshops led by teaching artists, and visitors will be able to learn about the sculptures through aPA's Museum Without Walls™: AUDIO program. "Rittenhouse Square is home to some of Philadelphia's many historic sculptures that feature animals," says aPA Executive Director Penny Balkin Bach. "Antoine Louis Barye, the French artist who created *Lion Crushing a Serpent*, was known as the 'Michelangelo of the Menagerie'; and *Billy* was said to have been inspired by Philadelphia sculptor Albert Laessle's family goat. Laessle even had a studio near the Philadelphia Zoo, which informed his animal studies. Our programming connects with such stories and creates new and unexpected situations for audiences of all ages to actively engage with Philadelphia's exceptional collection of outdoor sculpture."

- Sculpture Workshops: Stop by any of three tents set up near *Billy, Duck Girl,* or *Lion Crushing a Serpent* for artist-led sculpture making activities inspired by the existing sculptures and live animals. Participants will also receive a public art "goodie bag," which includes a customized sketchbook.
- Sculpture Demonstrations: Witness the unique sculpture-making process through sculpture demonstrations led by Philadelphia artists Darla Jackson, Stephen Layne, and Colleen Rudolf.

The sculptors will share their unique techniques working directly from life.

- Photo contest: Submit your best photos of the event by using #sculpturezoo on Instagram or Twitter. All appropriate photo submissions will be entered into a photo contest. The top three #sculpturezoo photo submissions will receive a prize.
- Listen to Museum Without Walls™: AUDIO: Public Art Ambassadors will be on site to share information about the aPA's award-winning Museum Without Walls™: AUDIO program, an interpretive program that shares compelling stories about Philadelphia's public art. Ambassadors will distribute MWW: AUDIO maps and guide participants interested in experiencing the program on their cell phones, smart phones, or online.
