

Rafael Lozano-Hemmer, Simulation of OPEN AIR, Philadelphia, 2012

Rafael Lozano-Hemmer's (b. 1967, Mexico City) projects with interactive lights have been staged in cities all over the world, including Dublin, Hong Kong, Lisbon, Liverpool, Lyon, Montreal, Rotterdam, Toronto, and Vitoria-Gasteiz, Spain. His work in kinetic sculpture, responsive environments and video installation has been shown in four-dozen countries. Lozano-Hemmer's interest "is to create intimacy and not intimidation." While the project is spectacular in scale, "what matters to me is that individual participants can personalize their city with their contributions. OPEN AIR is at once a visible voicemail system, a rant line, a public stage and an archive of recordings from Philadelphia's past and present." Concurrent with OPEN AIR, his work will be exhibited at New York City's bitforms gallery and the San Francisco Museum of Modern Art. For more information on the artist visit lozano-hemmer.com

## ABOUT OPEN AIR

Combining public art with mobile technology, artist Rafael Lozano-Hemmer presents the world premiere of OPEN AIR. Commissioned by the Association for Public Art (aPA), OPEN AIR is an interactive light experience directed by participants' voices and GPS locations. Two dozen robotic searchlights will respond creating unique light formations in the sky over Philadelphia's historic Benjamin Franklin Parkway. Inspired by the city's rich tradition of democracy and respect for free speech, OPEN AIR was created specifically for Philadelphia and for participation by the general public. The artist has addressed safety and environmental considerations in the design of OPEN AIR.

### HOW TO PARTICIPATE

#### FROM THE PARKWAY

- Download the iPhone app OPEN AIR PHILLY for free from iTunes.
- Record and submit your 30-second message. •
- Use the app to listen to the ongoing program.
- Priority is given to messages submitted from the Parkway.

#### ONLINE AT OPENAIRPHILLY.NET

- Record, submit your message, and select a preset light design.
- The highest rated messages will be entered into the message queue.
- Search the archive messages, which include "Voices of Philly", distinct individuals past and present that have inspired the flavor of Philadelphia.
